Red Oak Community School District Meeting of the Board of Directors Meeting Location: Red Oak High School Media Center Red Oak High School Campus January 8, 2018

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Red Oak Community School District was called to order by President Mark Johnson at 7:02 p.m. at the Red Oak High School Media Center.

PUBLIC HEARING

Public hearing on the proposed plans, specifications, form of contract and estimated total cost of the High School and Webster Elementary Asbestos Abatement projects.

President Mark Johnson opened the public hearing on the proposed plans, specifications, form of contract and estimated total cost of the High School and Webster Elementary Asbestos Abatement projects. Mark Pfister, Boyd Jones Representative, explained the proposed plans and specifications. There are separate bid packages for the High School and the Webster Elementary Building. Bid opening will be on Thursday, Jan. 11, 2018 at 2:00 p.m. There were no public comments. The public hearing was closed.

Approval of Agenda

Motion by Director Bryce Johnson, second by Director Blackman to approve the agenda with the order of agenda items at the discretion of the meeting chair. Motion carried unanimously.

Good News from Red Oak Schools

The Red Oak Community School District purchased 100 rakes and supplies for community service projects from \$1000 donated by the George Maher family. This gift is greatly appreciated and will allow more work to be done in the future.

Simultaneous Use Policy

Daric O'Neal addressed the board concerning the need for a simultaneous use policy. This item will be on a future agenda.

Webster Asbestos Abatement

Supt. Messinger stated he has received two inquiries which should be viewed as legitimate options for the use of the Webster Building. He did not feel either of the options are ready to move forward at this point, but people have expressed an interest. As a result, he recommended that the district should use this to their advantage and use Webster for storage for our project over the next year and further explore the interest level of the people who have expressed interest. Mayor Bill Billings updated the board regarding a new ordinance approved by the city council concerning abandoned property. However, if the school has materials stored in the building it would not be considered abandoned. Motion by Walker, second by Blackman to approve using the Webster Building for storage purposed during the construction project. Motion carried unanimously. No bids will be taken for asbestos abatement at the Webster Building at this time.

High School Asbestos Abatement

Motion by Director Carlson, second by Director Bryce Johnson to move forward with the proposed plans, specifications, form of contract and estimated total cost of the High School Asbestos Abatement Project. Motion carried unanimously.

Red Oak High School Sidewalks

Next year the main building will not be utilized for classes at ROHS. This means the entry point for students would change dramatically. They would be going from the student parking lot to the Tech Center. There is currently no sidewalk from the parking lot to the Tech Center. Supt. Messinger stated a sidewalk needs to be installed from the north side of the Tech Center to the sidewalk on the North Side of the High School. This would be the main path for students parking in the main lot. Mark Pfister stated that this sidewalk is included in the construction project plans.

Prime for Life: Prevention Research Institute

This item will be on the next agenda. Damon Clark was not available at the meeting to explain the program.

Mason City Community School Contract for Instructional Program for the 2017-2018 School Year

Motion by Director Blackman, second by Director Carlson to approve the contract with Mason City Community schools for regular or special education instructional program for 2017-2018 school year. Motion carried unanimously.

Change Order with O'Neal Electric on Baseball Field Sprinkler Wires

Motion by Director Blackman, second by Director Bryce Johnson to approve the change order with O'Neal Electric on the Baseball Field Sprinkler wires. Motion carried unanimously. This work was done in June 2017 but the district did not receive this invoice until Dec. 2017.

Renting of Classroom Space at the Wilson Performing Arts Building

Motion by Director Carlson, second by Director Bryce Johnson to approve renting of classroom space at the Wilson Performing Arts Building for the 2018-2019 school year in the amount of \$2500 per month rent, plus additional amount if after monitoring the expenses the amount needs to be increased. Motion carried unanimously. The school will also need to be flexible for the Wilson Performing Arts Building's uses.

Purchase of Storage Pods

Youth throughout the country are taught the curriculum through juvenile justice systems, underage DUI programs, court diversion, school student assistance, and similar programs.

Prime For Life® is an evidence-based intervention.

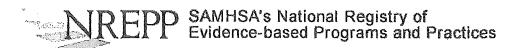
Prime For Life® is listed on the National Registry of Evidenced-based Programs and Practices (NREPP). This prestigious list is reserved for those few programs that have demonstrated effectiveness through independent scientific evaluation. Careful attention to research on how people change, and intensive field testing helped us develop effective protocols for Prime For Life® delivery. When implemented in accordance with protocols, Prime For Life® is effective in changing high-risk attitudes, beliefs, risk perceptions and behaviors, and has been shown to reduce recidivism in the DUI population.

Prime For Life® is nonjudgmental.

Few people change if they feel judged. In Prime For Life® we pay careful attention to words and experiences that promote inclusion, openness, and a lack of judgment. Instructors are carefully trained to create and atmosphere that makes it safe for people to openly explore, and inwardly examine how their choices are affecting their lives. Prime For Life® does not moralize or dictate. We believe people have reasons for their beliefs and behaviors and that with new understanding, self-evaluation, and support for change, most people are willing to consider change. No scare tactics...but deep self-evaluation.

INCLUSION IN NREPP'S LIST OF EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICES

Prime For Life® was selected by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) for inclusion in the National Registry of Evidence-based Programs and Practices (NREPP) in 2009. All the substance abuse intervention programs listed in the registry have been scientifically evaluated and rated by independent reviewers as part of SAMHSA's mission of bringing evidence-based practices to service providers.



lowa, 2006 POPULATION: 696 youth under age 21 who attended PRIME For Life between January and June, 2006, in a court mandated program in lowa. Twenty-four percent had one or more arrests for impaired driving.

EVALUATION DESIGN: One survey (pre-test) was completed before attending the PFL class and a second survey (post-test) was completed immediately after class. Matched pre-test and post-test data was available for 612 students. EVALUATOR: Prevention Research Institute, in consultation with REACH of Louisville, Inc. REFERENCE PRIME For Life Under 21 Iowa 2006 Youth Evaluation Report, Prevention Research Institute, Inc.

FINDINGS: in Attitudes, Beliefs, Perceptions of Risk, and Motivation to Reduce Use High-risk drinking and drug use choices are supported by common attitudes, beliefs, and risk perceptions on several dimensions, as well as low motivation to reduce use. After attending PFL, participants who were 17 years old and younger and those 18-20 years old each indicated significantly greater:

- agreement with attitudes and beliefs that are supportive of making low-risk choices;
- perception of risk associated with high-risk drinking and drug choices;
- perception of personal risk for developing alcoholism;
- motivation to reduce their use. The beliefs "If I drink as much as in the past, I could develop alcoholism," and "If I use drugs as much as in the past, I could become addicted," changed significantly more for participants who designated having three or more indicators of possible dependence than for those who with no indicators.

Behavioral Intentions and Detailed Plans 42% of those who had been making high-risk drinking choices in the 30 days before the program indicated they intend to make low-risk drinking choices in the 30 days following the program.

34% of those who used marijuana or other drugs in the 30 days before the program indicated intentions to not use in the following month.

Nearly 70% of participants also indicated that they had made detailed plans to avoid high-risk drinking and drug use and to substitute other activities.

Response to the Course: At the end of the course, most participants agreed that PRIME For Life helped them to decide to abstain or drink and/or use drugs less, helped them feel confident in being able to abstain or drink less or use drugs less, and helped them to develop skills to be able to abstain or drink less or use drugs less. These findings are consistent with the participants' reported intentions to make less risky choices in the future.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE PROGRAM

Project Towards No Drug Abuse (TND) is a drug prevention program for high school youth who are at risk for drug use and violence-related behavior. The current version of the Project TND curriculum contains twelve 40-minute interactive sessions taught by teachers or health educators over a 3-week period. Sessions provide instruction in motivation activities to not use drugs; skills in self-control, communication, and resource acquisition; and decision-making strategies. The program is delivered universally and has been used in both traditional and alternative, high-risk high schools.

OUTCOMES

Compared to control groups of students, TND students showed:

- 27% prevalence reduction in 30-day cigarette use.
- 22% prevalence reduction in 30-day marijuana use.
- 26% prevalence reduction in 30-day hard drug use.
- Long-term (at years 4 and 5) maintenance effect for 30-day hard drug use.
- 9% prevalence reduction in 30-day alcohol use among baseline drinkers.
- Lower probability of 30-day tobacco and hard drug use for the health-educator-led condition at the 2-year follow-up.
- Lower level of marijuana use among male baseline non-users in the healtheducator-led condition at the 2-year follow-up.
- 21% relative reduction in weapon carrying among males.
- 23% relative reduction in victimization among males.

RACE/ETHNICITY/GENDER DETAILS

Research indicates that the program is generalizable to a variety of ethnic groups, but potential differences across race and ethnic groups in program effectiveness were not reported. The effect of the program on violent victimization holds for males only, however.

RISK AND PROTECTIVE FACTORS

Risk Factors

- Individual: Early initiation of drug use, Favorable attitudes towards antisocial behavior, Favorable attitudes towards drug use, Stress, Substance use
- Peer: Interaction with antisocial peers, Peer substance use

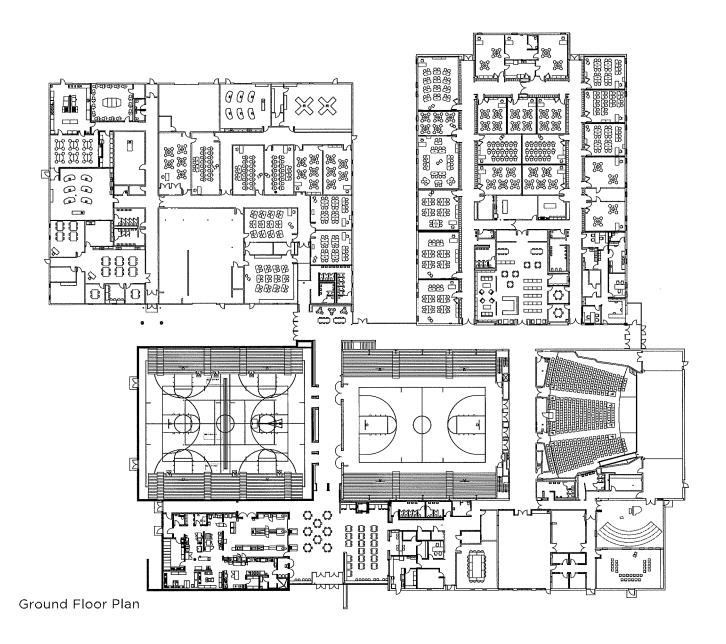

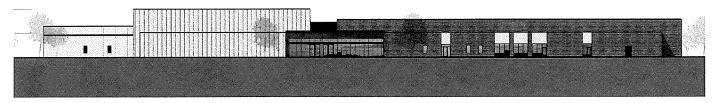

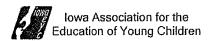

T.E.A.C.H. Next Steps for Supervisors

Welcome to T.E.A.C.H.! Thank you for supporting your employee on their higher education journey. This document provides an overview of steps to complete after your employee has been accepted to the T.E.A.C.H. program, and during each semester your employee participates in T.E.A.C.H. Everything listed here and more can be found in the handbook.



1. After your employee has been approved for a scholarship, you'll need to <u>sign and</u> <u>return the contract</u>.

2. Make a plan for release time:

- You have the entire semester to give the release time, regardless of the length of the class:
 - o Fall: August 15 December 31
 - o Spring: January 1 May 15
 - o Summer: May 15 August 15
- The number of credits taken may change each semester, so be sure to check in with your employee and/or T.E.A.C.H. counselor to make a plan at the beginning of each semester.
- Release time documentation (Form C) is due 30 days following the end of the semester.
- See reverse for release time tips and additional information.

3. Billing/Reimbursement:

- T.E.A.C.H. will pay tuition, in full, directly to the college or university. (At 4-year schools, we pay the public undergraduate university rate and the student pays the difference, directly, on their own.)
- Your program can expect a bill or reimbursement check after the 15th of the month following the end of the semester (i.e. January 15, June 15, September 15).
 - o T.E.A.C.H. will bill you for your portion of tuition and books and credit you for release time.
 - o The process is the same for participants. Programs and participants never exchange money related to the T.E.A.C.H. scholarship. Programs never pay money directly to the college.
 - NOTE: Any claim forms that are not turned into us within 30 days after the end of the semester may not be reimbursed.

4. At the end of the contract:

- Provide a raise or bonus if applicable. T.E.A.C.H. will send you a letter as a reminder.
- Sign a new contract if you plan to continue to support your employee on a T.E.A.C.H. scholarship.
- Send updated wage information to T.E.A.C.H.





Release Time Tips and Details

Release time is a required component of the contract. It is meant to acknowledge the time commitment the participant is making to their education and to your program. Forfeiting release time could cause the participant's contract not to be renewed. Contact your Counseling Specialist if you are having any problems giving release time.

- Most participants attend classes at night, on weekends, or online. It is not required that their release time be used to attend daytime classes.
- When you and the participant sign the Form C, you are confirming that the information is accurate.

When NOT to give release time:

- Part-day preschool contracts and directors are not eligible for release time.
- Participants are also not eligible for release time for summer semester if your program is not open during the summer semester.
- Directors and assistant directors are not eligible for release time unless 50% or more of their time is spent working directly with children.

When can Release Time be given? No release time is available when a program is closed (ex: programs that are closed during the summer). Release time can be given anytime during the semester that a course is taken, even if it is a fast track or short course that does not span the whole semester. Spring semester is Jan. 1-May 15; Summer is May 15-Aug. 15; Fall is Aug. 15-Dec. 15th. (Some schools offer a Winter term, which is Nov. 15- Feb. 15).

What are some ways to give Release Time? Participants should meet with their directors/supervisors before the semester starts to discuss when and how to take release time. The hours need to be documented on the Form C (Center Staff Release Time Reimbursement Claim) and can be completed by the director/supervisor or the teacher. Suggestions:

- Allow the teacher to come in late or leave early during the week, while ratios are lower
- Pay for lunch breaks that are normally unpaid
- Add time to their personal/sick leave
- · Pay for holidays that are normally unpaid
- Give small increments of time throughout the week rather than large chunks
- If staff have a scheduled afternoon or day off, it might be possible to pay them for this time
- A substitute could be hired specifically to cover T.E.A.C.H. participants. This usually works best for programs that sponsor T.E.A.C.H. contracts for several employees.
- T.E.A.C.H. participants could be allowed to bank their leave time and take off a whole day before a major test, or they could be given half days off so it would be easier to bring in a substitute.

How does Release Time work for Student Teaching? If the teacher does not work in the sponsoring program during student teaching, then no release time would need to be given. If the participant is still working some hours at the center each week where they are employed, while student teaching elsewhere, the program and individual can decide if/how they plan to do release time. T.E.A.C.H. can reimburse the program for this time if the program pays for the participant to have release time.





T.E.A.C.H. Overview for Centers/Schools

What is T.E.A.C.H.?

T.E.A.C.H. (Teacher Education and Compensation Helps) Early Childhood® IOWA is a comprehensive scholarship program that provides the early childhood workforce access to educational opportunities and is helping establish a well-qualified, fairly-compensated and stable workforce for our children. Scholarships have five main components:

Education

T.E.A.C.H. helps participants to earn a required number of college credit hours in early childhood education.

Scholarship

T.E.A.C.H. offers financial support to pay for college courses, books, travel, and time away from work.

Compensation

T.E.A.C.H. participants earn a raise or bonus after successful completion of a year of education.



Education of Young Children

Commitment

T.E.A.C.H. participants agree to continue service as a child care professional in their current early care and education setting.

Counselor

T.E.A.C.H. Counselors offer support to navigate the college process and T.E.A.C.H. paperwork.

Who is Eligible for a Scholarship?

Anyone who:

- Works in a regulated preschool, child care center, or home program for at least 30 hours per week (or full time for the hours a preschool offers programming for a minimum of 20 hours/week)
- Has worked with children birth to age 5 in their current program for at least 3 months (6 months for bachelor scholarships)
- Is working toward an early childhood degree, credential, or endorsement at an lowa college (or would like to be)
- Has the support of their employer (if applicable) and provides proof of participation or willingness to participate in a quality initiative such as QRS, QPPS, Head Start, or NAEYC/NAFCC accreditation.

Scholarship Options

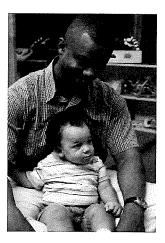


What does T.E.A.C.H. provide?

- Percentage of tuition and book costs
- Travel/Internet stipend each semester
- Portion of the cost of participant's release time
- Share of the bonus cost for participants, if applicable
- Counseling for participants
- Administrative support for the program
- Collaboration with colleges and universities

What is expected of my program/me as a supervisor?

- Contribute a portion of tuition and book costs
- Provide teachers paid release time each semester, if applicable
- Award the teacher either a raise or bonus upon completion of the one-year scholarship contract, if applicable



What is expected of my employee(s)?

- Attend classes and successfully complete at least 9 credit hours during the T.E.A.C.H. contract year
- Continue employment at your program for an additional year, upon completion of the contract year.
- Contribute 10% of tuition and book costs for each course. Many teachers are eligible for a federal Pell grant, which may cover this 10% and the center's portion. (Pay difference to college for tuition above public rate at 4-year schools.)

Choosing a contract type

T.E.A.C.H. has three basic models for full time staff. In all models, teachers contribute 10% of the cost of tuition and books and programs provide paid release time. A Counseling Specialist can help you choose the model that works best for your program.

- The *raise* model: programs contribute 10% of the cost of books and tuition, and agree to provide a 4% (or greater) raise, above any raise all staff receive.
- The **bonus** model: programs contribute a percentage of the cost of tuition and books, and agree to contribute toward a bonus.
- The *plus* model: (for programs that cannot provide a raise or bonus) programs contribute a higher percentage of tuition and books and T.E.A.C.H. pays the entire bonus.

How much will it cost?

Costs vary depending on how much financial aid an employee receives, how many courses they take, book costs, and which model you choose. T.E.A.C.H. Counselors are able to provide you with an estimate tailored to your program.

Other things to consider:

- Contract requirements
 - o Reimburse Iowa AEYC when billed, for your percentage of tuition and books.
 - o Provide Iowa AEYC with demographic information about the program.
 - Notify Iowa AEYC with any changes in the participant's employment status.
- Program Options you have the ability to create your own internal policies for T.E.A.C.H. You might consider policies about:
 - Which employees will be supported.
 - How many individuals your program can support at a time.
 - o The consequences of quitting/termination.
